ABOUT NUMISMATIC CLUBS

Numismatic clubs are full of people from all walks of life who, just like you, enjoy collecting coins and/or banknotes (also medals, tokens and other numismatic items).

Visitors are always welcome at club meetings – no need to take out a membership first.

All members of numismatic clubs were beginners at one time and most are more than willing to share their knowledge and experience with you. This sharing of knowledge is one of the main benefits of being a member.

The members of numismatic clubs cover the full spectrum of coin and banknote collectors:-

- those who collect new releases of the Australian mints,
- those who specialise in one or more areas or countries;
- those who like to collect a little (or lot) from across the world: and
- those who collect on limited budgets.

Members value the benefits of membership in their club, with the friendships and contacts that their membership brings.

WHAT CAN A NUMISMATIC CLUB PROVIDE?

Many numismatic clubs offer:-

- An opportunity to purchase coins, banknotes and accessories at reasonable prices from other members;
- Fairs and exhibitions;
- Displays or visiting speakers;
- Newsletters or magazines;
- Access to numismatic catalogues and books.

Perhaps the greatest benefit of being a club member is the friendship, knowledge and experience of other members on the various aspects of collecting, including:-

- Identifying coins and banknotes;
- Where to get coins and banknotes;
- Storing and housing your collection;
- Ideas on new collecting areas.

Note that stamp events (such as fairs and exhibitions) often include numismatic items for sale. Contact your local club for details about upcoming numismatic events.
